**Swami Sahajanand College offers undergraduate courses in three streams:
Arts, Science and Commerce**

Arts stream

The Bachelor of Arts (B. A.) requires three years of full time study consisting of six semesters. The College offers 21 honours courses in 14 Arts subjects: Anthropology (Arts), Economics, English, History, Hindi, Home Science, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, Sanskrit, Sociology, , Geography, Mathematics (Arts) and Urdu. Besides honours, we also offer B.A. General Course. Apart from the specific honours Papers, the Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC), Generic Elective (GE), and Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Papers are included in the Programme. Arts Degrees are focused on increasing a students' knowledge and critical thinking in accordance to the syllabus and curriculum prescribed by the university. These courses are aimed to prepare students with a sound knowledge and skills to earn livelihood and to contribute in the development of the country.

Science Stream

The Bachelor of Science (B. Sc.) requires three years of full time study consisting of six semesters. The College offers 6 Honours courses in six science subjects: Anthropology (Sc), Botany, Chemistry, Mathematics, Physics and Zoology, and B. Sc. General course. Apart from the specific Honours subjects, the Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC), Generic Elective (GE) and Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) are included in the curriculum. These courses prepare students for reasoning ability, problem solving, critical and analytical thinking, safety measures and laboratory practices.

Commerce Stream

The Bachelor of Commerce (B. Com.) requires three Years of full time study consisting of six semesters. The college offers Honours and General courses in

Commerce program. It aims to prepare students with the knowledge and skills to understand and participate in the field of business, trade and economics.
